Patient Participation Group Update National GP Ballot/Industrial Action

collective-action-patient-information/

GP partners have voted in a national ballot to take collective action which may affect services.

The British Medical Association (BMA) has explained the cause of the action "Of the entire NHS budget, general practices get only 6% of guaranteed funding. The BMA's GPC England Committee believes this needs to gradually increase by 1% year on year, to 15% - all the while protecting existing funding across the wider system." BMA continues "GPs have now reached a desperate point but will not be shutting their doors." The NHS has produced a leaflet explaining how collective action may affect you as a

patient, linked here https://www.england.nhs.uk/long-read/gp-

CGHB Explanatory Note: This ballot was about funding for GP practices only. The funding allocation is provided to practices on a per patient basis and used to pay for all GP practice costs. GP partners (those doctors financially responsible for running GP practices, are saying this is not enough to provide sufficient resources for patients.

Each individual practice will decide on the way in which they will act locally from a list of options. We are awaiting a statement from our practice to explain how this will impact Camrose, Gillies, Hackwood and Beggarwood (CGHB) patients. - Pressure Relief Pillow or tablet/iPad support to help cope with challenges after heart surgery, mastectomy or other surgeries.
- Zip2PICC Hoodies -Oakley Stitchers provide hoodies that have been adapted to allow access for PICC line and gastric treatments, such as dialysis and chemotherapy. These items are provided at cost.

Oakley Stitchers have 9 stitcher and craft groups that meet across the Basingstoke and Deane area to encourage learning, social interactions and enable like-minded people to meet each other and forge new friendships. They also run sewing machine workshop sessions

COUNCILLOR'S UPDATE

DIGESTER LIAISON MEETING: I went to the Anaerobic Digester liaison panel at the beginning of August to talk about two important subjects. At the top of the agenda were continuing reports of odour pollution. Though these are less frequent than they used to be, and the operators are anxious to eliminate them completely, they still impact local homes. The problem is experienced most on days when wind speeds are low - the days when people are most likely to want to be in their gardens. The operators will be making further checks into why the problem persists. I also had questions about the proposed introduction of food waste collections, which could have a serious impact on Hatch Warren and Beggarwood.

DOMESTIC FOOD WASTE COLLECTIONS: I raised my concerns about the food waste collections at the Borough Council's cabinet meeting where they took the decision to introduce them. I want to know whether the waste that is collected from next year onwards will be brought to the Farleigh digester for processing. If that is a possibility (and it is), a series of questions then need to be answered: will the refuse lornies drive directly to the Digester (causing potentially more trips along Woodbury Road), or will there be a transit station at which the food waste will be assembled and loaded onto a larger vehicle? Will some of the long distance food waste lornies that currently go to the digester be displaced? I was told that the contracts are likely to be decided by tender, and Biogen will be interested in taking part in that process. I have asked for a meeting with the Leader of the County Council to discuss the implications.

MCDONALD'S 24/7 APPLICATION: although the summer holidays can be a quiet period in terms of Council meetings, big issues can still be progressing. One of them was the licence application from McDonald's for 24 x 7 operation of their new outlet at the Hatch Warren Retail Park. I have objected to the application because of the impact it could have on the security of the site. I don't want to see car meets returning there. I believe that public safety will be put at risk if security in the car park is relaxed, crime and disorder will be allowed to return and a public nuisance will be created if unauthorised car meets are able to start using the site again. The Hatch Warren Retail Park is a vulnerable location, having been used in the recent past for unauthorised car meets. Activities included 'donutting', revving of engines and loud exhaust noises in a location that abuts a residential area and Beggarwood Park. These caused a danger to life and a nuisance to thousands of residents. The car meets are also associated with cars using local roads as a race track, dangerous driving and at least one documented loss of control. Because of these events, I had previously asked for a meeting with the management company and persuading it to lock the gates to the car park at 10.30pm each night. After that, the misuse stopped. To have the gates re-opened at night will invite the criminal misuse, the dangers and the nuisance to return. If that happens, the situation will be more serious than before, because now illegal activities will mix with the legitimate traffic of customers attending the fast-food outlet. Lives will be put at risk.

MITIGATION MEASURES: if the Borough Council's licencing committee feels that it cannot refuse the McDonald's application, I have thought about measures that could be taken to protect the public. I have recommended that no permission be granted until a review has been taken of the safety of the site and an agreed mitigation plan put in place. Mitigations to the dangers I have described could include:

- No 'eating in' after 10pm at night.
- Gates to stop entry and exit on the 'Lidl' side of the car park, which is where the 'donutting' took place. These to be locked at 1030pm each evening.
- Extra traffic calming measures to reduce the risk of dangerous driving on the 'McDonald's' side of the car park.
- The introduction of car parking regulations allowing a maximum stay of (say) fifteen minutes after 10.30 pm. This would allow customers to obtain their takeaway food, but would not allow 'car meet' activities.
- The installation of Automatic Number Plate Recognition cameras to record and automatically issue penalties to vehicles remaining longer

than allowed after 10.30pm. This discipline has been implemented across the road at the Sainsbury's car park to allow access to the cashpoint machine only.

There may be more options for curtailing the danger of car meets returning but I offered these ideas as a start to discussions. The better decision would be to refuse the application outright.

CAR MEETS: To illustrate the fact the car meets remain a serious problem, Basingstoke's Police Inspector authorised a Section 35 dispersal order over the summer to help control this anti-social behaviour. The order granted Officers additional powers to require a person to leave the area and rendered anyone failing to comply as committing a criminal offence, putting them at risk of arrest. This illustrates why the Hatch Warren Retail Park continues to need defending. Whilst I welcome the tougher line, I believe the problem lies not just with dispersing the meets, but also stopping and arresting drivers who then go on to use our local roads as a race track. The noise is intrusive and one day their irresponsible behaviour will cause an accident.

WAREHOUSES APPLICATION: I am concerned about the impact that could be caused if the latest application for warehouses near junction 7 is approved. I wrote to the Borough Council urging it to turn it down. My concerns centre round the impact on the road system, especially if changes take place to the motorway junction, and the impact the development would have on the neighbouring conservation area. I believe that the proposals would offer a poor gateway into Basingstoke, and that there is already a surplus of unfilled warehousing jobs in the area. I believe a science park would be a better option for the site.

INDUSTRIAL ACTION AT GP SURGERIES: In its newsletter, the Patient Participation group has written that GP partners have voted in a national ballot to take collective action which may affect services. Each individual practice will decide on the way in which it will act locally from a list of options. The PPG is waiting for a statement from the Camrose, Gillies, Hackwood and Beggarwood practice to explain how this industrial action will impact patients in Hatch Warren and Beggarwood.

ROAD SURFACE BREAKING DOWN: I have reported that part of the road surface on the brick section of Danebury Road, near St Mark's School, Basingstoke is breaking down and looks hazardous, especially for cyclists. The problem is around a drain cover and extra care is recommended.

A30: the white lining has been completed on the section of the A30 that recently received its surface dressing. In the middle of August there were diversions in place to cater for overnight remedial works on the Brighton Hill roundabout.

BROADMERE ROAD ADOPTIONS: I remain frustrated and angry that the roads are still not adopted. I have received reports that street lights have been replaced, correcting a problem where many of them were out. That is positive. Apparently some problems remain regarding access to drainage, and I am chasing for answers on these.

THEFTS FROM CARS: Local Police are warning of an increase in reports of unknown person(s) trying car door handles and in some cases gaining entry to vehicles and removing items. These type of incidents are often opportunistic. The offenders hope to find vehicles that have been left unlocked. Police advice is for us to be extra vigilant and to ensure that vehicles are always left secure and locked with no valuables left inside.

HATCH WARREN SUMMER FESTIVAL: I offer my thanks and congratulations to the Community Association for its very successful Summer Festival held on the Community Centre Field. The weather was perfect, right up to closing time, when Hatch Warren was hit by a torrential downpour. Some 4,000 people attended. Thank you to everyone involved in organising the day, which is one of the events that helps to enrich our area.

OLD DOWN WILDLIFE GROUP

Here we are at the end of summer with autumn almost upon us. Have you, or are you, making use of nature's harvest? Fruits and nuts abound. There seems to be a really bumper crop of blackberries this year — think blackberry jam, blackberry wine, blackberry and apple pie or crumble. Many species of birds feast on blackberries, such as blackbirds, finches, thrushes and robins and small birds often nest within large clumps of bramble. Mammals will also eat blackberries such as squirrels, hedgehogs and dormice. Prior to use, soak the blackberries in a weak mix of water and vinegar for about 20 mins and then rinse with water. Blackberries freeze really well and are a good source of fibre and vitamins C and K. There are also sloes (fruit of the blackthorn) to pick. Best use for sloes is surely sloe gin for Christmas! Sloes can also be used to make jam and jelly but need lots of sugar as not sweet like blackberries. And there are hazel nuts to pick. But please always leave enough for the animals to enjoy!

The wildflower meadow on Old Down has been wonderful again with some flowers being particularly abundant like Oxeye Daisy, Kidney Vetch, Wild Carrot and the several species of orchids on site have really spread this year.

Old Down Wildlife Group is desperately in need of more members. In addition to work party support the Group needs help with administrative tasks such as research, transects, species surveys and identification, event planning, website and social media. So please consider joining us — supporting Old Down is not just about work parties.



COURGETTE SPANAKOPITA

Every year we get very excited when the first courgette arrives but before long we are at a loss to know what to do with them before they turn into monsters! This recipe is one way of dealing with a courgette glut. This recipe can be amended to available vegetables. Add spinach, chard or whatever is available. It's cheap and easy.

- Pkt of filo pastry
- I large onion, sliced
- 2 cloves of garlic, crushed
- 3-4 medium courgette, sliced Salt and pepper
- 200gm feta cheese
- Dried oregano
- Butter
- Olive oil

Heat olive oil in pan and add onion. Cook gently till they are starting to get soft. Add garlic and then the courgettes. Cook till softening – add more oil if necessary. Add dried oregano to taste and season with salt and pepper.

Unwrap filo pastry and spread out one sheet onto baking try. Brush with melted butter and place another sheet on top. Brush with the butter and top with third sheet of pastry. Spread courgette mixture on top leaving border around the edge. Break up feta cheese and sprinkle over the top. Repeat layers of filo. Fold edges up to keep stuffing in place, Brush with melted butter and place in oven at 180 degrees C. Cook for about 20-30 mins. Cool slightly and serve with salad.

So why Basingstoke? He believes that this is a place where he can make a difference. He would like to see a place where people had a good life, a home and there was no longer a need for food banks.



KEMPSHOTT CONSERVATION GROUP

It's time to restock

We are now wild flower seed collecting on selected conservation sites across Basingstoke. The seed is collected from individual species when the conditions are right. This complements the work of the Council's Green Ranger Team who mechanically harvest mixed seed on meadows across the borough. While this is a useful technique there are many instances where more selective manual harvesting is necessary. We had been doing this for over five years then COVID struck and forced us to stop.

Wild flower seed has a limited germination life. We took the opportunity to use most of the old accumulated seed stock on sites in Kempshott immediately post-COVID, but now stocks are very low and need replenishing.

As individual species are collected, it's a great way to broaden knowledge of wild flowers. Once collected, we also need help cleaning and processing the seed. This can be done by anybody anywhere with only a little training. We have some volunteers at Kempshott village hall coffee morning hubs who have offered to help. Additional recruits are very welcome at the hall or at home.

It's alright for some

Despite the poor weather, this year has been a fantastic one for orchids. In Down Grange Meadow it was the best year for Common Spotted Orchids, not just in numbers but in new locations. Unfortunately, our main clump of Pyramidal Orchids was overshadowed by Rose-bay Willow herb. This clump of around a hundred orchids is located underneath the Willow herb.

In a normal year the Orchids are out just before the Willow herb canopy closes over them. Due to the wet winter, this year has seen the Willow herb get into growth earlier and more vigorously, so

hiding the orchids. However, Pyramidal Orchids have been popping up in new locations as well. This is a shot taken on 26th June of a single plant in the middle of one of our triangles scraped and seeded ten years ago.

KNOW YOUR RIGHTS: APPEALING A PARKING TICKET

Citizens Advice Basingstoke is a charity providing free and confidential advice on a wide range of issues including benefit eligibility, homelessness, employment and energy enquiries.

Here, we are looking at rights around appealing a parking ticket. You can appeal a ticket if you think you were parked correctly. For example, if a parking attendant thinks you stayed too long when you were in fact within the time limit.

By law, a Penalty Charge Notice (PCN) or Excess Charge Notice (ECN) from the council – issued on public land, such as a high street – must be cancelled if you didn't break the parking rules. You can check these rules on GOV.UK or on signs near where you parked.

When you park on private land, such as a supermarket car park, the parking rules (the terms and conditions of using the car park) should be made clear on nearby signs. If you're given a Parking Charge Notice and can prove you stuck to these rules, your ticket should be cancelled. This is because the parking company can't argue that you didn't stick to their terms and conditions.

SPIRITUALLY SPEAKING

Hope, guidance and community—Can religion, faith and spirituality have a positive impact?

Recently on social media I came across a message from someone asking for advice about whether religion could help them. This is a big question with a multifaceted answer.

Many people don't feel religion is for them, they find solace in other things, and they question how religious or spiritual beliefs could add anything to their life.

Research from, amongst others, Havard University, notes that participation in a spiritual community can improve physical and mental health, extending life and decreasing suicide rates. A belief system can aid a sense of meaning and hope with community support and healthy coping mechanisms.

Religion typically refers to an organised system of beliefs and traditions handed down through generations, encompassing specific moral codes and narratives about the nature of existence. To have faith means to trust and believe in something beyond the immediate and the tangible. Faith shapes our identities, relationships, and experiences. Spirituality is an inner path enabling a person to discover the essence of their being and the deepest values by which they live.

Sadly, some experience authority figures misusing their power. Teachings on sin and morality can deeply impact sense of self causing guilt and shame. War and violence can occur when extremist individuals or groups perpetuate intolerance and discrimination claiming their harmful behaviours are motivated by religion. Unfortunately, the actions of a few can perpetuate misunderstanding. It is important to acknowledge distress occurs and seek to foster healthier, more inclusive religious environments and support those who have been adversely affected.

People often search for 'something' in times of need, perhaps when experiencing a health crisis, when troubled by difficulties in relationships or moving through life transitions.

When searching for meaning and purpose, organised religions can provide a framework with teachings about the purpose of human existence, it can guide our attitudes and how we choose to live. Some people explore their inner selves and their connection to the universe, leading to a personalised sense of meaning that resonates deeply with their unique experiences. When searching for meaning and purpose religion and spirituality are not mutually exclusive.

When looking for a source of comfort or hope, religion can help provide stability with specific practices such as prayer, worship, and sacraments. A belief in an afterlife or a higher power can alleviate pain and suffering. Practices like meditation, mindfulness, and connecting with nature can help foster a deep sense of peace and well-being. Sharing community activities with others who share your beliefs can build strong bonds, providing social support and a sense of belonging. Sharing a mutual quest for growth can be deeply meaningful, no matter what the specific belief.

My personal answer to the original question went as follows: "As a Christian, it helps me to follow Jesus' teachings and to have a personal relationship with God, I know he's always there for me. I appreciate the community to which I belong, it helps me adhere to my values, for example radical non-judgmental acceptance." For me, spirituality, faith and religion all intertwine and are vital for overall health.



RESTAURANT REVIEW

THE BOLTON ARMS

The Street, Old Basing RG24 7DA 01256 643636

After being closed for some time during which refurbishments took place this hostelry reopened early this year and what a pleasant ambiance exists in this ancient building. Built in the fifteenth century this Grade II listed building is owned by the Bolton family estate and has gone through several regenerations and now presents itself as a welcoming gastro pub.

Madam and I visited along with some friends and from a wide array of selections from light bites, buffet and extensive main courses it took some time to make decisions. Madam had an omelette with ham and mushroom, so large it must have used four eggs, which came with a salad garnish and a side plate of fries. My choice was deep fried scampi which again came with some salad leaves, tomato and peppers and fries that were so hot that they had obviously been tipped from the fryer to my plate.

Mr friend also had the same scampi dish while his wife had the oriental crispy duck salad which arrived in a dish so deep the impracticality of trying to use a knife and ford in such a yawning vessel made it necessary to empty the contents on to a plate.

Desserts were crème brulee for Madam and my friend while his wife had ice cream, and my selection was treacle tart with ice

Coffee to follow and our pre lunch drinks had been a zero lager for me and Madam had her usual slim line tonic with ice and a slice. Our bill came to £56.00 which we thought to be good value taking into consideration the quality of the food and portion sizes..

NEWS FROM CAGE

'What's happening about the warehouse plans at Dummer?'

Keeping up to date isn't easy as so much is happening but we want you to know what's going on, to write again to BDBC restating why you object to the warehouse plans, and to ask you to attend the forthcoming Planning Meeting (September or October - date as yet unknown).

It is SO IMPORTANT that the BDBC planners and Planning Committee (DCC) members know YOUR views.

So here is a summary of where 'things' are now.

- It's becoming clear that traffic and its management is a key issue
- Still relevant is the Impact on the landscape (the reason HM Inspector turned down the previous plan)
- HCC has asked Newlands the developers to address items in their traffic assessment
- The lighting proposed in the Southwood Farm area will change the countryside environment forever
- The traffic plans as we understand are potentially unenforceable given experience elsewhere.
- The occupiers of the 8 warehouses are still unknown. Two smaller warehouses may not use HGVs but smaller local delivery vans.


